NEWS FROM THE FRONT OFFICE

The School of Choice application process will open at **10:00 am on Monday, March 4, 2019** and applications will be due on or before **March 15, 2019 at 4:00 pm**. The School of Choice applications will be submitted through an online application process only. Parents/Guardians must have a ParentVUE account in order to fill out an application. See the district website to set up an account if you don't currently have student in MCVSD 51. Please contact the front office if your student is currently enrolled and you need a registration form for ParentVUE. **Students who are currently attending Broadway under the School of Choice policy do not need to re-apply for the upcoming school year 2019-2020.**

Visitors/Volunteers: Please enter our building through the front doors and wear an ID badge. Thanks for all you do to help keep our children safe. Volunteers please remember to record your hours in the Volunteer's Log in book on front counter.

REMINDERS FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Remember the playground is NOT supervised before 8:30 am or at any time after school. Children should NOT arrive on the playground until 8:30 am. Students may be in the building at 8:20 if they are eating breakfast.

Students are expected to arrive to class on time. When a child is late to school he/she misses out on important information and interrupts the classroom instruction. Our tardy bell rings at 8:50 a.m. If your child arrives late, parents need to come into the front lobby to sign their student(s) in the attendance book. The student(s) will get a pass to their classroom.

Appropriate dress for school. Students should dress appropriately for weather conditions. We will continue to have recess even on cold or hot days. Students should wear clothing that covers their shoulders completely (avoids sunburns

and possible injuries from fall on grass/asphalt); shorts, skirts and dresses (bike shorts under dresses and skirts, if possible) should be fingertip length; and stomachs covered.

Please help us maintain a nice traffic flow by remembering and adhering to the following procedures:

- Stay with your car if you stop along the curb. The curb in front and to the west of the building is for PICK UP / DROP OFF ONLY.
- If you are going into the building, even briefly, please park in a parking space.
- If you are parked out in the lot, away from the curb, please get out of your car, walk and meet your child at the curb. For safety reasons, children are instructed to remain on the sidewalk until escorted by an adult.
- Park on Village Way to avoid the parking lot congestion. Students will be exiting through the gap in the fence.

NEWS FROM HEALTH OFFICE

Remember ALL medications (including cough drops) must be brought to the health office by an adult. If your student is experiencing any of the following symptoms they should not attend school:

- Fever - for a fever of 100⁰ or higher a student should stay home. They can return to school after 24 hours of no fever without medications.
- Cough – If your student is experiencing severe, uncontrolled coughing or wheezing, rapid breathing or difficulty breathing they should stay home.
- Vomiting - If your student has been vomiting in the last 24 hours they should stay home. They may return to school when they have not vomited in 24 hours without medication.
- Rash – Staying home is suggested if the rash is spreading quickly; has open, weeping wounds; is not healing; comes with a fever or coughing; or appears along with behavior changes.
- Diarrhea – Your child should stay home if they have diarrhea. They can return to school after 24 hours of no diarrhea without medications.
- Mouth Sores – Staying home is necessary if your child is drooling uncontrollably.

KINDERGARTEN ROUNDUP



We will be hosting Kindergarten Round Up on March 27th from 10-4 PM. The office will be open for parents to complete this process by dropping off the required paperwork (see below). The **ONLINE REGISTRATION** process will be open from March 21- March 26. The link to this online registration is: http://www.d51schools.org/parents/enrollment_and_registration/kinder_roundup. Parents will need a ParentVUE account in order to register for Kindergarten.

Your child must be 5 on or before July 15th. You will need to provide a state issued birth certificate, immunizations, and proof of residency (ie, Xcel or Ute water bill, lease agreement) in order for the registration process to be complete and your student placed in a classroom for the 2019-2020 school year. A classroom tour with our Kindergarten teacher will be held before school begins. Date and time will be sent to all our new families.
